

MINERALS DEVELOPMENT ACTS 1940 TO 1999
Notice of Intention to grant Prospecting Licences

WHEREAS it appears to the Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural Resources, “the Minister”, that there are minerals under the lands described in the Schedule to this Notice and that such minerals are not being worked,

TAKE NOTICE THAT, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by subsection (1) of Section 7 of the Minerals Development Act 1940, as amended, the Minister intends to grant prospecting licences in respect of **Base Metals, Barytes, Silver, Gold and Platinum Group Elements** to **Teck Ireland Limited, 5 Wentworth Place, Wicklow.**

THAT he has deposited in the office of the Geological Survey of Ireland, Beggar's Bush, Dublin 4 and in the Garda Stations indicated in the Schedule to this notice maps showing the boundaries of such lands,

AND THAT in the event of objections being made within 21 days from the date of this notice, to the granting of any of these licences, the Minister reserves the right to make details of the objections available to the licence applicant where he considers this necessary in order to fully consider the validity of any of the objections received.

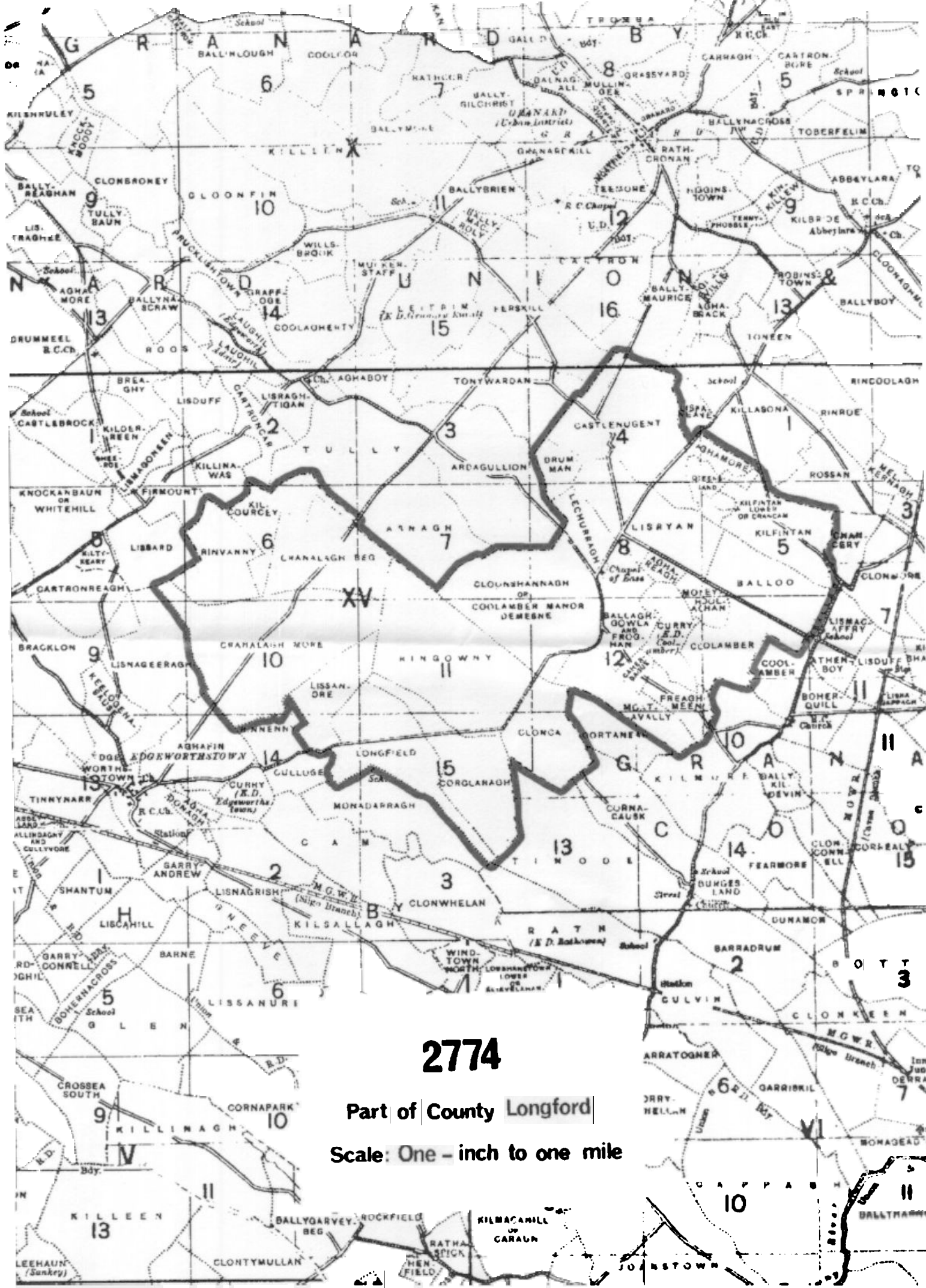

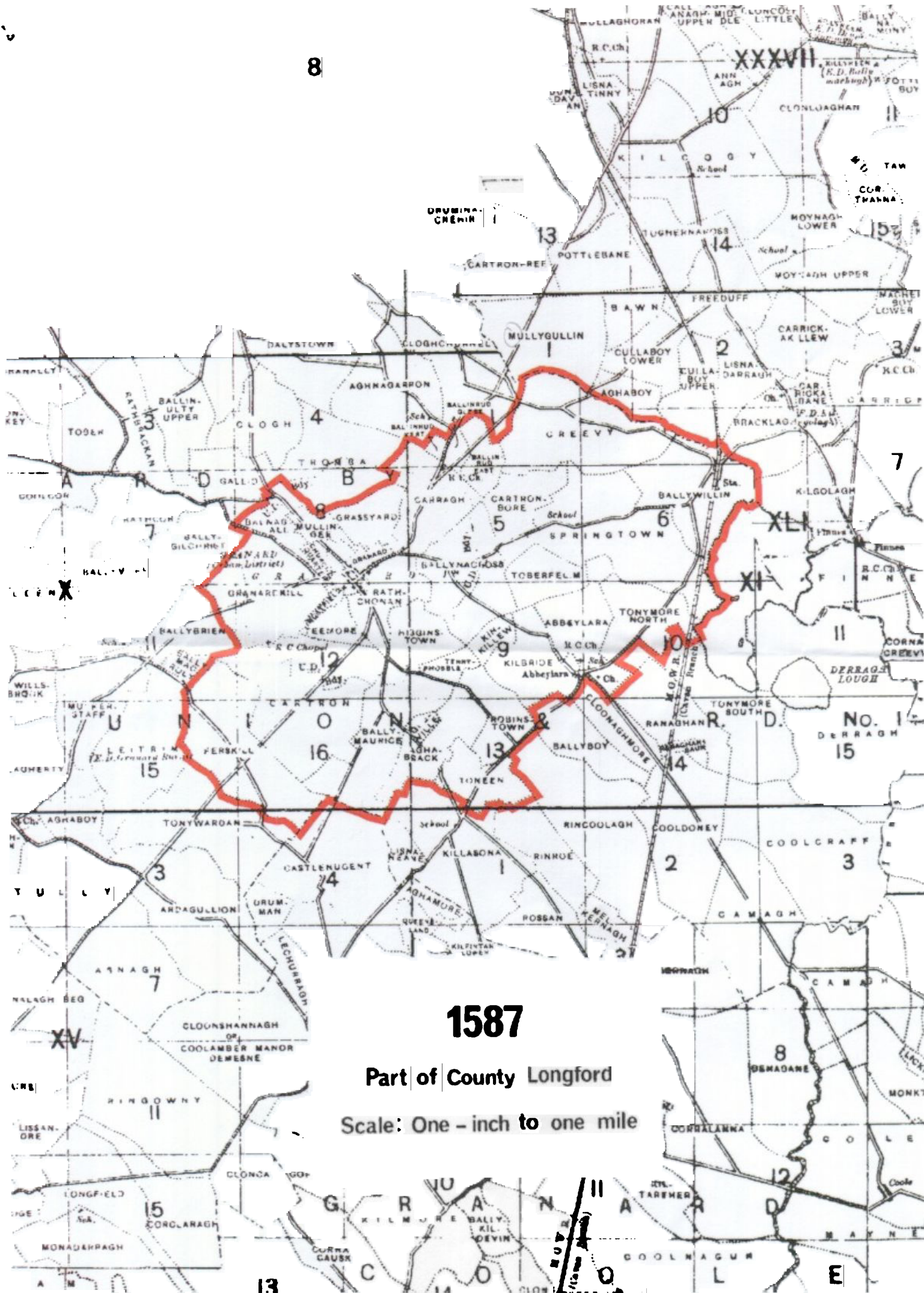
