LOCAL GOVERNMENT (NO 2) ACT, 1960 AND AMENDED BY THE PLANNING AND
DEVELOPMENT ACT, 2000, AS RESPECTS ALL OF THE LAND TO WHICH THE
COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER RELATES TO BE PUBLISHED IN
ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 78 (1) OF THE HOUSING ACT 1966 AS AMENDED
BY THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACTS 2000 -2010

**COMPULSORY ACQUISITION OF LAND
LONGFORD COUNTY COUNCIL
COMPULSORY PURCHASE (CLOONFIUGH BRIDGE) ORDER 2011**

Longford County Council has on the 1st day of March 2012 made a Confirmation Order confirming the above-named Compulsory Purchase Order as respects the land described in the first schedule thereto. The said Order, as so confirmed, authorises The County Council of the County of Longford to acquire the said land compulsorily. It will become operative three weeks from the date of the publication of this notice, but if an application for judicial review of the decision of the board under order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (SI No. 15 of 1986) is duly made to the High Court within eight weeks of the date of publication of this notice in accordance with section 50 of the Planning and Development Act 2000, the Court

- A) may by interim order suspend the operation of the compulsory purchase order as so confirmed either generally or in so far only as it affects any property of the applicant until the final determination of the proceedings;
- B) if satisfied upon the hearing of the application that the Compulsory Purchase Order as so confirmed is not within the powers of the Housing Act 1966, as extended by section 10 of the Local Government (no.2) Act, 1960 (as substituted by section 86 of the housing Act 1966)(as amended) or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Housing Act 1966 as so extended and amended, not having been complied with, may quash the order as so confirmed either generally or in so far only as it affects any property of the applicant.

A copy of the order as so confirmed and of the map and schedules referred to in it, may be seen at the Offices of Longford County Council, Roads Department, Great Water Street, Longford during normal office hours, Monday to Friday.

The Order also authorises the Local Authority to extinguish the Public Right of Way described in the Second Schedule thereto, by Order made by them after they have acquired the said land.
