Community Grant Support Scheme 2026

Overview

Longford County Council, through the Municipal Districts, is committed to working in partnership with the community to encourage, develop, support and sustain a wide range of activities and projects (for example recreational, artistic, cultural, social and community support) that

- Make a positive contribution to County Longford
- Promote the development of strong local communities
- Improve the quality of life of our citizens.

The Community Grant Support Scheme (CGSS) provides a means for decision-makers, that is the elected members of Longford County Council and each Municipal District to consider and prioritise applications for grant assistance.

Longford County Council, as a member of the Local Community Development Committee, is committed to the values of dignity, autonomy, democracy, inclusion, and social justice and their associated value objectives as set out in the *Equality and Human Rights Statement of the Local Community Development Committee*.

The Intercultural Fund is included under the Community Grant Support Scheme for 2026.

Community groups with a county-wide focus must apply under the separate Members' Countywide Fund 2026.

What's not covered

- Operational costs, including salaries, utilities and insurance, are ineligible for funding
- Activities and projects eligible for other grants administered by Longford County Council; for example, Community Climate Action, Estate Management, Arts, Creative Ireland, Burial grounds maintenance, Anti-litter specific projects, and so on.
- Activities and projects eligible for or that received funding from national grant schemes and programmes (except for matched funding applications towards such projects)
- Political events or projects.

Terms and Conditions

- Activities and projects must benefit the local community and be promoted by Longford based not-for-profit, charitable and community and voluntary groups.
- All publicly funded facilities and events should be open to all members of the public without exception.
- Activities and projects should make some contribution to one or a number of the values/objectives in the Equality and Human Rights Statement of Longford LCDC; see [LCDC Equality and Human Rights Statement](#)
- Applications must be submitted via the online CGSS 2026 application system by **the chairperson, secretary or treasurer** of the group making the submission, and must be completed in full.
- Bank account details must be provided and must be in the name of the community group.
- Groups must be affiliated to Longford Public Participation Network (PPN); [PPN online registration](#)
- All Community Groups must provide their Tax Registration Number (TRN).
- If annual payments to your group exceed €10,000, details of current Tax Clearance Certificate or Tax Clearance Access Number must be provided.
- The information supplied by the group must be accurate and complete - misinformation may lead to disqualification and/or the repayment of the grant.
- Applicant must have no outstanding liabilities to Longford County Council.

- Applicants must be willing to support Probation Service Initiatives.
- It is the responsibility of each group to ensure that it has proper governance, procedures and policies in place including appropriate insurance to support the proposed activity/project.
- If the proposed activity/project includes children or young people under 18, each group must have in place a child protection policy including a vetting procedure.
- Successful applicants for grants exceeding €1,000 will be required to complete an online evaluation report on the completed activity/project funded, including evidence of expenditure, receipts, photographs, and so on.
- Successful applicants will be required to comply, if applicable, with all requirements in relation to Planning, Building Regulations, Health and Safety and Fire Codes.
- Longford County Council's contribution must be publicly acknowledged in all materials associated with the purpose of the grant - publications, media, and so on.
- Approved applicants give permission to Longford County Council to use photographs of their funded project for publicity purposes.
- The Cathaoirleach and Elected Members of the relevant Municipal District must be invited to official openings or events where funding has been awarded under the Community Grant Support Scheme.
- Only one application per group (including any joint initiative) will be considered.
- Specific conditions may be attached to any grant award, including insurance indemnity.
- Breaches of the terms and conditions of the grant scheme may result in sanctions, including disbarment from future grant applications.
- Applications will be screened centrally for adherence to the above criteria.
- Longford County Council will publish a list of all grant awards on its website.
- The Freedom of Information Act applies to all records held by Longford County Council.
- In certain circumstances an Event Management Plan and Traffic Management Plan will be required. If this is required, the committee should appoint an Event Controller and Safety Officer to prepare the plans and manage the event.
- Successful applicants at Municipal District level are ineligible for funding from the County Wide Members' Fund.
- Applicants who may not have access to the internet or their own computer are advised they can be facilitated at any of the Broadband Connection Points (BCPs) or public libraries in the county.
- Longford County Council Library staff will be available to assist people with completing their online applications.
- Grant awards can be drawn down as soon purchases are made or projects are completed, and must be drawn down in full by the end of October 2026.
- Applications for retrospective grants and late applications will not be considered.
