

Healthy Ireland funding through Healthy Longford 2026

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I have to submit an expression of interest? Can I not just submit a full application form?

A: Only successful EOIs will be invited to apply through application form which will seek more specific details about the project, quotations for the elements to be funded, and other supporting documentation.

Q: Who is eligible to apply for this grant?

A: - NGOs/Community organisations/ service providers delivering community services in County Longford

- Consortiums of two or more organisations where the lead partner is an NGO/community organisation delivering services in County Longford.

Q: Who is not eligible to apply for this grant?

A: - Individuals or private businesses

- Statutory service delivery which should normally be undertaken within the remit of that statutory organisation

Q: What projects are eligible for this grant?

A: Applications for innovative community health & well-being initiatives that respond to the context of, and the outcomes required that have been set by Healthy Longford. Project activities must be additional to the usual business of the applicant and complement but not replace mainstream funding streams. We are seeking details of interactive projects that can be measured using set measurement tools of either M1 questionnaires and EVI questionnaires. We aim to fund projects that deliver programs that raise awareness of community health & well-being OR activities and training-based projects that enhance community well-being and health in a groups local area OR countywide.

Q: What is the timeframe for project delivery?

A: All projects must be complete, with monies spent and required documentation, including project report, submitted to Healthy Longford by 27 November 2026. Projects failing to adhere to this timeline will be deemed - ineligible and funding will be required to be returned.

Q: When will we receive payment of funds?

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A: Projects are funded in two tranches, 70% upfront once SLA signed and relevant documentation returned and 30% will be provided at completion of project.

Q: We are a recently established/small organisation and don't have audited accounts/PPN Registration or Tax Clearance Number. Will this be a problem when applying at phase 2?

A: Smaller organisations may not have a requirement to produce audited accounts. If this is the case for your organisation you should explain this and provide a record of recent financial records (e.g., income and expenditure for the previous year). You should apply for a tax clearance number and register with the PPN –see the guidance and Terms & Conditions Document for help on this.
