#### SUBMISSION TO LONGFORD ISSUES PAPER

## Information about Keep Ireland Open

KIO is a voluntary organisation whose primary aim is to lobby for the legal right to reasonable access to the countryside which is the norm in virtually all European countries but is denied to us. However, we are also concerned with issues which affect the enjoyment of our countryside. Our membership covers a broad spectrum of recreational users of our countryside including An Oige, Scouting Ireland, Catholic Guide of Ireland, An Taisce, Friends of the Irish Environment, Federation of Local History Societies, Irish Hang Gliding & Paragliding & Irish Rural Link. We are members of Comhairle na Tuaithe.

We make this Submission as a national body but also on behalf of our members living in the county.

In answer to the Key Questions in 6.0 Transport and Movement in your excellent Issues Paper we welcome the sentiments expressed especially from the 9<sup>th</sup> pt to the end. These matters are fully explored in our Submission. Otherwise, as our submission is very focused on issues of walking/cycling, public rights of way and better rather than answering the questions therein, we are basing our submission on a critique of the 2015 Plan.

## CRITIQUE OF EXISTING PLAN

We presume that you will use the 2015 Plan as the basis for the new one as it contains much excellent material. It does, of course, require expansion and updating.

We would respectively point out that the 2015 Plan fails to comply with, have regard to/take into account: Planning & Development Acts Plans in adjoining counties Development Plan Guidelines

Heritage Act 1995 National Heritage Plan

This failure will be highlighted in our Submission. We trust that the Draft Plan will comply in all respects with the above.

The mention of a provision in the Plan, without comment, indicates our support for the wording with appropriate updating.

Counties in **bold** are adjoining and/or counties within the **Midland Region**.

## Other county plans

While you are obliged to take into account plans in adjoining counties, you may care to take into account plans in other counties particularly those within the **Midland Region**.

Review of Plans in adjoining counties or within the Region We presume that you will be monitoring the review of the Plan in **Westmeath** and that you will liaise with their planners to ensure that the plans are compatible, where appropriate.

#### **FORMAT**

**Index** We submit that you should provide an Index as recommended in the Development Plan Guidelines (5.15). See Clare, DLR, Sth Tipp & Waterford.

**Layout** The present layout creates difficulties when referring to particular points. We note that the Plan has sub-numbered or sub-lettered many lists of points. We submit that this should be extended to all lists. We also submit that paras should be

numbered or lettered. Also, you should include the Sec title & its number on each page.

## 4. Economic Development

## 4.4 Agriculture

We submit that you **should include an additional para**: Farmers will be encouraged to see themselves as **custodians of the countryside** and the rural landscape which are a valuable resource for present and future generations and provides an amenity for enjoyment of the general population. Based on **Cavan** 3.5 EDO6 1<sup>st</sup> sentence & **Leitrim** 3.7.2 2<sup>nd</sup> para under Pol 61 & 3.8.7 2<sup>nd</sup> para 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence.

### 4.4.1.1 General Policies

AGR 2: We submit that this should be replaced by: Protect and conserve rural amenities, archaeological and natural heritage, visual amenities, eco-systems, landscape, scenic views and the environment generally, from adverse impacts of agricultural practices and development particularly in high amenity areas and ensure that it is appropriate in nature and scale, ensure that it does not have an undue negative impact on the visual/scenic amenity of the countryside and identify mitigating measures where required. Integrate into the landscape, including the minimal use of signage. Developments and practices must be necessary for the efficient use of the farm and must ensure that they are conducted in a manner consistent with the protection of the environment and in line with national legislations and relevant guidelines. Based on Laois 5.10 RUR13, (e), Offaly 10.6 RDO4 and many other counties.

We submit that you **should include an additional sub sec:** Forestry

**Note** We are surprised that you have no Pol in this important area unlike virtually all other counties.

Commercial Forestry Pols

- **1** Develop, promote, provide, protect, improve and encourage greater **public access** to new and existing forestry, both state and private, for recreational activities such as walking, cycling, orienteering, horse riding and other non-noise generating activities and the provision of bridle paths and nature trails, as part of connected network of walking and cycle routes in cooperation/consultation with Coillte, the Forest Service, private landowners, local interest groups and other stakeholders and agencies for the benefit of local communities and tourists. Based on **Smarter Travel 2009-2020** Act 17 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence page 45, **Westmeath** 3.41 P 4, 6.21 P 10 & 6.23 P 12 1<sup>st</sup> phrase, **Laois** 5.10 RUR4 and many other counties.
- 2 Retain existing rights of way and identify them and established walking routes before planting commences and maintain them as rights of way/walking Routes. Taken from Cavan 3.9 EDP15 & EDO 31.
- 3 Ensure that existing **public rights of way**, traditional walking routes or recreational or tourist amenities are not obstructed. Taken from **Roscommon** 3.4.2 Pol 3.44 1<sup>st</sup> sentence.

**Note** If this isn't done walking routes tend to become subsumed into the network of forest roads thus making it very difficult, over time, to establish the existence of these routes.

- 4 Forestry must not be visually obtrusive in the landscape so as to ensure that development is appropriate in its character, nature and scale and that it is carefully managed to so that it doesn't result in damage to visual amenity or have a negative visual effect on the rural environment and character of the countryside and that it must enhance and be in harmony with the landscape. Protect views and scenic routes, nature designations, vistas, geological sites, monuments, archaeological or other historical or heritage features, and in Primary and Secondary Amenity Areas. ## **Amenity Woodlands**

6 Minimise the loss of trees associated with development manage and promote the **preservation** and enhancement of the existing network of **woodlands** as they contribute to landscape character and landscape

conservation and protect them from development that would impact adversely on them. Based on **Laois** 7.13 NH22 1<sup>st</sup> phrase and many other counties.

7 Encourage the use of the **Neighbourwood** and Native Woodland Scheme to enhance existing woodlands or create new ones. Taken from **Her Plan** 5.3.

## **Commercial Forestry and Amenity Woodlands**

8 The broad zone of deciduous woodlands shall be protected from inappropriate development. Protect and encourage access to forestry and woodlands, in co-operation with Coillte, private landowners and other stakeholders for walking routes (including long distance and looped walks), nature trails, bridle paths, orienteering and hiking for the benefit of local people and visitors. Our submission relates only to rural recreation and rural tourism.

We submit that it should be divided into **Sub secs**:

- A Tourism\*
- B Recreation\*\*
- C Recreation & Tourism\*\*\*

We submit that this topic, as it doesn't solely relate to tourism should be repositioned in 6.2.2.7

We submit that while Ecotourism is mentioned this sub section should be deleted and should be repositioned as follows:

A 1<sup>st</sup> sentence up to *Inny* merged with Inland Waterways 2<sup>nd</sup> para 1<sup>st</sup> sentence.

B The rest of the sentence Bogs, Woods and Rural Landscape

**C** 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence should be upgraded to a Strategic Pol and replaced by: Generally require tourism and recreational related developments to locate within existing towns and villages to prevent environmental damage, except where the nature of the activity renders this impossible. Based on **2015 Plan** and many other counties.

#### **Tourism Product**

We submit that the the word product" in the title and in the text should be replaced by experience which better reflects the feelings of the people of Longford towards visitors.

## **Tourism Objectives**

\*10. We submit that this should be replaced by: Encourage, enable, support, facilitate, promote rural tourism by the provision, development and expansion of such activities as walking, cycling, mountain and other off road biking, riding, painting, photography, field studies, adventure sports, hiking, back packing, rowing, orienteering, swimming in waterways, boating, bird watching, heritage, nature and wildlife trails, hang and para gliding, canoeing and kayaking, pony trekking, archaeological guided walks and eco-, geo- & green-tourism including the provision of supporting infrastructure.   Applications for tourism development will be considered in line with

  heritage, cause harm to the appearance and character of the landscape
  and can be readily absorbed into its surroundings by taking advantage of
  existing vegetation and/or topography and any ancillary built
  development is small in scale, will be subject to high standards of design
  and materials and is sympathetic to the environment in its siting, layout
  and landscape treatment. See Kilkenny 7.3 1st para 1st, 3rd & 5th pts.

Ensure the protection of environmentally sensitive areas and areas identified as sensitive landscapes in the LCA by taking into account its location and design, that landscapes and the environment are protected so that they can be enjoyed and cherished by future generations and that natural heritage, landscape, rural countryside and amenities are protected. Ensure that development is in sympathy with the environment, heritage and amenities that built development and other activities associated with

Developments must minimises adverse impacts on landscapes leaving them undiminished as a resource for future generations and must be sensitively located, sited, designed and landscaped so that environmentally sensitive areas are protected. Ensure that development must be sympathetic in manner in regard to the environment, heritage and amenities. Based on Offaly 2.11.10 2nd para, Westmeath 3.14 P 3 and many other counties.
- \*14 Last phrase We submit that this should be replaced by: Encourage, enable, support, facilitate and promote the provision, development and expansion of appropriate agri-tourism initiatives in the form of on-farm visitor accommodation and associated and spin-off activities such as health farms, heritage and nature trails, pony trekking, water based activities and open/pet farms Based on Roscommon 3.4.1 P 3.31 & 6.11.2 11th line, Leitrim 2.3m) & many other counties.

\*We submit that you **should include an additional Pol**: Ensure that all built elements of agri-tourism protect and conserve the landscape and the natural environment and are appropriately located, screened, designed and satisfactorily assimilated into the landscape and do not

have an unduly negative impact on the **visual/scenic amenity** of the countryside or natural heritage and that they will not take away from the rural character and appearance of the area. Buildings in visually sensitive areas must address the surroundings. Based on **Leitrim** 2.3 Pol 2b) & 3.7.2 Pol 61 5<sup>th</sup> line and many other counties.

3rd para We submit that this should be upgraded to a Pol and replaced by: An EIS, including a remedial EIS, will be required where the thresholds outlined in Sch 5 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 are reached. Ensure that proposals for aggregate extraction include an assessment of the impact on the natural heritage. The Council will also exercise its powers under Article 103-subsection (1) to require an EIS for sub-threshold development where it is considered that the development would be likely to have significant\* effects on the environment or heritage. The size of the proposed development and the cumulative workings of the area will be taken into account when assessing planning applications. Appropriate mitigation measures must be included. Based on Cavan 3.8 EDP9 1st sentence and many other counties.

## MA 2: c) & l)

m) We submit that this should be replaced by: Protect, conserve, preserve and safeguard recorded monuments and areas in their vicinity, World Heritage Sites, archaeological sites and features and zones of

archaeological potential, natural heritage, natural environment, listed views and prospects, features of natural beauty or interest, designated and prescribed sites, geological sites and areas of geological/geomorphological interest and areas of high scenic amenity from inappropriate development. Applicants must recognise that the aggregates(stone and sand/gravel deposits and mines) concrete products industry have a particularly sensitive role in relation to the environment. Any development of aggregate extraction, processing, delivery must be carried out so that it minimises adverse effect on the environment and visual amenities whether in respect of new quarries or extensions to existing ones. Development will be prohibited if the quality of the environment or landscape, particularly sensitive landscape, is adversely affected or there is a reduction of the visual amenity of areas of high amenity. All working should be landscaped either by the retention of existing vegetation or by screening. Based on Laois 8.5 DM69 f), Cavan 3.8 EDP6 & 7, Offaly 2.8.6 3rd para & 2.9 RDP 14 1st sentence, Roscommon 3.4.4 last para & 3.57 and many other counties.

### We submit that you should include additional Pols:

1 Applications for new development for aggregate extraction, processing and associated processes, shall **identify existing public rights of way** and walking routes which may be impacted on or are adjacent to the development site. They shall be kept free from development as Rights of Way/Walking Route. Taken from Cavan 3.8 EDO25.

#### Note

Pending a complete listing of public rights of way, walking routes, as prospective rights of way, should be protected.

2 Restrict development of aggregate extraction, processing and associated concrete production which could impinge or impact **on** matters of public importance, **public rights of way** or walking routes and satisfactorily address the potential impact on recreational or tourist activities and protect tourism amenities. #### 5. Infrastructure

We note that walking/cycling is dealt with not only in this Sec but also in 4.5 Tourism. Walking/Cycling is a broad topic and encompasses the reasons why people walk or cycle including travelling to work, schools and shops and for exercise and for recreation. As walking/cycling is becoming an increasingly important part of peoples' lives we feel that it

merits a separate chapter. At the very least it should be cross referenced.

Fencing of Hitherto Open Land

**Text** 

1 It is a requirement of the Planning Regulations 2001 Art 9(I)(a)(x) that

the fencing or enclosure of land open to or used by the public

during the ten years preceding such fencing or enclosure for recreational purposes or as a means of access to any seashore, mountain or other place of natural beauty or recreational utility, requires planning permission. Taken from Kilkenny 6.2 **Fencing** 1<sup>st</sup> sentence.

As new fencing of land open to or used by the public during the ten years preceding is not exempt development in accordance with Art 9(I)(a)(x) of the Planning and Development Regulations the following criteria will be used when considering planning applications for new fencing: Fencing, particularly in upland, highly scenic or amenity areas, will not normally be permitted unless such fencing is essential to the viability of the farm and that it conforms to the best agricultural practice. The nature of the material to be used, the height of the fence, and in the case of a wire fence the type of wire to be used will be taken into account. Stiles or gates at appropriate places will be required. Barbedwire will not be used for the top line of wire. - 5 Section 14 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 sets out the formal process for designating rights of way in development plans. The scope of these statutory provisions is grounded on identification of existing routes over which PROWS are deemed to exist. The inclusion of PROW objectives for their preservation provides greater protection for such routes under development management provisions of planning legislation whilst also restricting the scope of certain exempt development. Taken from Wicklow Vol 1 10.3.8 3<sup>rd</sup> para.

  Notes:
- 1 The wording in the Planning Act is quite clear: Each new development plan must fulfil the above requirement and no deferment will be permitted. See DOCELG letter to all Councils of 25/10/12 (PL 09/12).
  2 Counties who have complied so far: **Cavan** 8.10 Table 8.4, Clare App 6, DLR App G, Donegal Part B App 3 T 15, Meath App14, Kerry Vol 2 App 6, Kilkenny App D, **Roscommon** 8.7 Map 19, Sligo 6.7.4 **Public rights of way** Table 6.A, Sth Tipp 6.3.7 3<sup>rd</sup> para, **Westmeath** App 8 & Wicklow Vol 1 Table 10.3
- **6** The listing of public rights of way is an urgent matter as the lack of certainty on access has not only affected the rights of local people but has been the major cause of **the failure of walking tourism to reach its full potential**.
- 7 If an Interim list is included in the Plan the following should be appended to the list or provided in the written statement: *This is not an exhaustive list and the omission of a right of way from this list shall not be taken as an indication that such a right of way does not exist.* Taken from **Cavan** 8.10 2<sup>nd</sup> para last sentence.
- 8 There is an excellent modus operandi for listing taken from Cavan 8.10 NHEO45: Identify the existing public rights of way which give access to seashores, mountains, lakeshores, riverbanks or other places of natural beauty or recreational activity using the following methodology:

Place an advert in local papers seeking submissions from the public to identify public rights of way which give access to seashores, mountains,

lakeshores, riverbanks or other places of natural beauty or recreational utility.

Identify existing rights of ways, paths, and access points to seashores, mountains, lakeshores, riverbanks or other places of natural beauty or recreational activity.

Identify access points to seashores, mountains, lakeshores, riverbanks or other places of natural beauty or recreational activity which the Council have maintained or repaired with a view to identifying public rights of way.

Carry out a desktop analysis of public records, maps, aerial photographs and newspaper accounts to identify reputations of public rights of way. Once the list is compiled, advertise and put it on display. The public will be invited to make submissions on the validity of the public rights of way. Endeavor to verify and list the public rights of way and begin the formal process for designating rights of way under Section 14 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended).

Vary the Plan to include the list and map showing the public rights of way.

#### **Pols**

- 1 In accordance with the provisions of either Sections 206 or 207 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 encourage and facilitate the creation of additional rights of way and extend existing ones for pedestrian or amenity reasons, by investigating named areas to facilitate the development of waymarked ways and looped walks, by undertaking a review/survey of green links and cycling routes and by bringing forward proposals within two years of the adoption of the Plan, either by agreement or by the use of compulsory powers, for the creation of public rights of way, particularly in areas of high amenity and recreational importance and to the Royal Canal, lake shores, river banks, forests, heritage and scientific sites, areas of historic, archaeological, architectural, cultural and recreational importance and National Monuments, to create a meaningful network. Provide linkages from built up areas to the countryside and to link with public rights of way in adjoining counties. Based on Westmeath 7.15 O 3 1st sentence and excluding 2<sup>nd</sup> phrase, Leitrim 3.10.7 Obj 108, Laois 13.12 P93 and many other counties.
- **2** Provide, and where necessary, improve **signposting** and waymarking on all public rights of way. Based on **Westmeath** 7.15 O 4 and many other counties.

**Note** It is most important that public rights of way are marked on the ground because:

- A Walkers need to know of their existence to encourage usage
- B Signage would alert local residents to planning applications affecting the integrity of rights of rights of way
- C Directional signage during the course of the route would prevent involuntary trespass on private property and prevent walkers getting lost which might impinge on walker safety.
- 3 Protect and promote **Greeenways and consider designating them** as public rights of way. Taken from Laois 7.21 PRW5 1<sup>st</sup> phrase.
- **4 Identify and map**, **on an ongoing basis**, **public rights of** way and incorporate them in the Plan by way of a Variation. Where appropriate links to established public rights of way in adjoining counties will be identified. Taken from **Westmeath** 7.15 O 1.
- 5 Carry out further research regarding the identification and mapping of other potential public rights of way. Such research will be carried out in consultation with elected representatives, members of the public, recreational organisations, relevant statutory bodies, landowners and farming organisations for consideration for inclusion of any further identified public rights of way by way of variation in accordance with Sec 13 of the Planning and Development Act 2000(as amended). Part of such project may give rise to proposals for the creation of new public rights of way and/or extending /re-routing of existing public rights of way in accordance with respective provisions of either Secs 206 or 207 of the Act. Taken from Wicklow Vol 1 0.3.8 NH 47.
- 6 Designate Pilgrim Paths as public rights of way.

  Note We submit that as these Paths have been walked for many centuries their case for designation is surely irrefutable.
- 7 Identify mass paths and routes to holy wells, mass rocks and penal mass stations and consider designating them as public rights of way.
- **8** Encourage the provision for the common good of a **network** of Public Rights of Way to traditional outdoor amenities, including heritage sites and features of archaeological interest, national monuments, rivers, forests, lakes, geological and geomorphic systems, water corridors

places of natural beauty and other natural amenities. Taken from **Westmeath** 7.15 P 1 1<sup>st</sup> sentence 2<sup>nd</sup> phrase.

- **9** *Identify public rights,* under the provisions of Sec 14 of the Planning and Development Acts 2000(as amended), by marking them on a at least one map forming part of the Development Plan and by indicating their location within one year of the adoption the Plan which will be amended by way of a variation. Based on **Laois** 7.21 PRW 1 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence and many other counties.
- 10 Recognizing the importance of protecting and maintaining public rights of way especially in tourist areas and those which provide access to archaeological sites, National Monuments, lakeshores, riverbanks, water corridors or other places of natural beauty or recreational activity and to encourage and facilitate the development of cycling and walking in areas of high amenity, identify, maintain, preserve, protect, enhance, support, promote and improve them for the common good and ensure that development does not impinge thereon. Ensure that they are effectively maintained by controlling undergrowth, trees and bushes. Based on Roscommon 8.7.1 Pol 8.37 and may other counties.
- **11 Prohibit development** and keep free from obstruction public walking routes and public rights of way, particularly those at lakeshores, riverbanks or other places of natural beauty or recreational activity and take legal action if necessary, to prevent any attempt to close them off. Based on DLR 4.1.2.13 LHB14 4<sup>th</sup> pt & Wexford 15.9 Obj RS36, See also **Laois** 7.21 PRW2 2<sup>nd</sup> phrase & **Leitrim** 3.10.7 Obj 110.
- **12** Look favourably on planning applications which include proposals to **improve the condition and appearance** of existing rights of way. Taken from **Laois** 7.21 PRW5 2<sup>nd</sup> phrase.
- 13 Existing Public Rights of Way and established walking routes shall be identified prior to any new forestry planting, new infrastructural, energy/telecommunications or golf course developments. Taken from Kildare 14.12.2 RW 3.
- **14 Development will not be permitted where a public right of way might be prejudiced**, unless specific arrangements are made for suitable alternative linkages and that the developer can demonstrate that the level of amenity is maintained by:
- (i) the footpath/bridleway being diverted by the minimal practical distance and the route continues to be segregated from vehicular traffic;

- (ii) Appropriate legal procedures have been undertaken to extinguish the existing right of way and to establish the new right of way to replace it. (iii) the diverted route is of at least equal character and convenience. Based on **Leitrim** 4.5.12, **Laois** 7.21 PRW6 and many other counties.
- **15** Where, in the interests of proper planning and development, the **extinguishment of an existing right of way** becomes expedient, the Council may require the provision of a suitable alternative. Taken from Galway City 4.5.1 4<sup>th</sup> para 3<sup>rd</sup> sentence.
- **16 The Council will utilise its relevant statutory powers** to preserve as practicable the character of listed public rights of way. Taken from Wicklow Vol 1 10.3.8 NH46 1st sentence.
