St Christophers walk this loop daily and a footpath for them is brilliant, especially the wheelchair and buggy users for a smoother enjoyable walk and for safety purpose.

The housing development however I would have reservations over. It important to have green/wild area in estates. The estate is quiet we have St Christophers independently houses in it and I would be concerned with its expansion.
