(i) CONSIDERATION OF THE CAPITAL BUDGET 2025-2027

John McKeon, Director of Services presented to the Members the three year Capital Budget 2025 to 2027. This investment programme is subject to Grant & Loan Funding and will change as this becomes known and is always also subject to Capital Reserves & Development Levies being available to the Local Authority.

The members raised their concerns from the presentation in relation to the provision of Affordable Housing, funding for the Void Programme, provision of Playgrounds, the provision for a new headquarters for the Civil Defence and the need for Industrial Sites. John McKeon responded to the members queries.

John McKeon thanked Fema Flannigan, Financial Accountant in the preparation of the Capital Budget and he also thanked the Directors of Services for their input.

The following Notice of Motion was proposed by Councillor Martin Monaghan and seconded by Councillor Uruemu Adejinmi

I call on Longford County Council to allow communities to apply for funding for generators for community centres/halls. These facilities proved to be vital in providing an emergency hub for our communities, as seen in the most recent storm.

Response:

Activities and projects that benefit the local community are eligible for consideration for funding under the Community Grant Scheme 2025. The Scheme is currently open for applications and any application received for funding for generators for community centres/halls by the closing date of 4pm on Monday 31 March 2025 will be considered for funding by the Elected Members of the relevant Municipal District in which the facility is situated.

The following Notice of Motion was proposed by Councillor Peggy Nolan and seconded by Councillor Paul Ross

I call on Longford County Council following the impact of storm Darragh and Eowyn, to seek funding from the National Government to put in place, community hubs in each municipal area and to have those hubs equipped and supported to serve our communities in future emergencies. The funding must cover the provision of generators and as the fund should be an annual allocation. Resources could be expanded to support and serve the public in times of crisis and future emergencies. This funding must be used at the discretion of Longford County Council to ensure all plans put in place can effectively assist the most vulnerable in our communities.

The following Notice of Motion was proposed by Councillor Padraig McNamara and seconded by Councillor Martin Monaghan

I call on Longford County Council to write to Minister for Housing James Browne regarding the Housing Adaption Grants for Older People and People with Disabilities, highlighting the urgent need for a review. The current grant criteria fail to adequately support the most vulnerable in our society, as they do not cover essential upgrades such as emergency fire exits for bedrooms where double-glazed windows are in place, despite these windows being unsuitable as escape routes. Additionally, the grants should incorporate renewable energy solutions to reduce heating costs, ensuring that older people and individuals with disabilities can live safely and affordably in their homes.

The following Notice of Motion was proposed by Councillor Sean Mimnagh and seconded by Councillor Mick Cahill

I call on Longford County Council to establish and implement a structured maintenance program for walkways throughout County Longford to ensure their safety, accessibility, and long-term sustainability.

This program should include regular inspections, repairs, and upgrades as necessary to enhance the usability of walkways for residents and visitors alike.

Furthermore, adequate budgetary provisions should be allocated to support this initiative, ensuring these walkways remain in optimal condition.

Response:

Following Storm Éowyn, significant damage was experienced in the County's walkways. The Roads team began works on clearing fallen trees and debris from these once the roads were cleared. Surfaces in certain areas have been damaged.

As part of the 2025 budgetary process, the Elected Members allocated funding for the maintenance and upkeep of walkways and greenways in the County. As this funding is limited (€25k per MD), works will have to be prioritised and included in the programme of works for the Area teams. The teams will also liaise with Coillte in relation to walks under their control. The Regeneration Team have successfully applied for funding for the upkeep and upgrade of certain walkways under the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS). This work will be carried out in collaboration with the Area teams.

The introduction of Community Wardens in the Environment section will support Longford Council's inspection programme.

It is also hoped that the Elected Members will provide additional funding as part of the budgetary process for 2026.

It was agreed to write to Bord Na Mona to discuss the maintenance of these walkways.

I call on Longford County Council to write to Minister Darragh O'Brien at the Department of Climate, Environment & Energy and Department of Transport, to request that he instructs the ESB to permit owners of solar panels to switch over to exclusive solar power when power cuts occur. It is understood that under current regulations that is not permitted.

I call on Longford County Council to provide a train service for Longford to Sligo and vice versa – I seek the support of the members on calling on larnród Éireann and the NTA to examine the possibility of providing a morning and evening commuter train service Monday to Friday between Longford and Sligo, to cater for the large number of people who work, attend college, hospital appointments etc., on a daily basis. There is a demand for such a service and I feel that it would be extensively used and would be welcomed by the communities who live along or close to the Dublin – Sligo line.

Response:

Longford County Council will write to larnrod Éireann and NTA in relation to the above Notice of Motion. We will request an early commuter service to provide transport for college students and workers which currently is not provided for by larnrod Eireann.

The following Notice of Motion was proposed by Councillor Martin Monaghan and seconded by Councillor Seamus Butler

I call on Longford County Council to reintroduce the roadside pumps – in light of the recent water outages due to ESB issues, I am calling on Longford County Council to bring a programme of works to reinstate/refurbish/reintroduce the usage of our roadside water pumps and

wells. These will then form a part of an emergency plan in the event of future water outages in our rural areas.

Response:

The supply of water is provided for by Uisce Éirenn. This matter should be referred to Uisce Éireann as they are the water authority.
