- (i) Permanent 24-Hour Taxi Rank

That Longford County Council carries out a review of the current taxi rank arrangements on Ballymahon Street with a view to establishing a permanent 24-hour taxi rank in one designated location, to improve road safety, accessibility and the efficient operation of taxi services within Longford Town.

- (ii) Raised Zebra Crossing, Park Road

That Longford County Council assesses the existing zebra crossing on Park Road, opposite the former Steele's premises, with a view to replacing it with a raised zebra crossing to improve pedestrian safety and assist with traffic calming in this increasingly busy area.

- (iii) Wave of Light

That Longford County Council approves the lighting of the Council Offices in pink and blue on 15th October 2026, subject to the approval of the Corporate Policy Group (CPG), in support of the 'Wave of Light' ceremony taking place at the Memorial Garden, Great Water Street, Longford, to mark International Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day and to remember all babies lost through miscarriage, stillbirth and neonatal death.

I call on the Minister for Public Expenditure, Infrastructure, Public Service Reform and Digitalisation and the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage to urgently increase the State subsidy available for local authority affordable housing schemes in light of escalating construction and development costs which are driving up house prices and reducing affordability for working individuals and families.

The Council further calls on Government to provide additional capital funding to reduce the financial burden placed on Longford County Council through its equity contribution to affordable housing projects, ensuring that affordable homes remain

genuinely affordable and that future housing developments are not jeopardised by funding shortfalls.
