Why does Roads process personal data?

The Roads department processes your personal data to:

- Develop a public road network adequate to cater for modern traffic
- Provide the necessary infrastructure to support economic and social development
- Ensure the safety and needs of all road users
- Manage traffic and parking in County Longford.

What personal data does Roads process?

The following is a list of personal data we process:

- Name
- Address
- Email address
- Financial details such as bank details for making payments
- Phone number
- Personal Public Services Number (PPSN)
- Driving Licence or Learner's Permit
- Health data
- Vehicle registration
- Staff training details
- Land ownership details
- Tax registration number
- Employment record
- Ethnic origin
- Images from traffic warden's body camera or possibly from security CCTV in Council buildings.





What does the law say about how we process your personal data?

There are three situations when Roads may process your personal data:

Situation	Example
We are legally obliged to process your personal data	Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 (as amended)
To allow us to carry out a task in the public interest and or in our official duty as a local authority as allowed under Local Government legislation	To ensure maintenance and safety of public roads
To carry out contract	When paying for supplies and services



Who does Roads share your personal data with?

We may share your personal data with the following, but only when necessary:

- An Bord Pleanála
- Garda Síochána
- Auctioneers
- ESB and other utility companies
- General public (for example, we may share images of you with your consent if volunteering at a road safety event)
- Insurance representatives
- Legal representatives
- Local media
- Office of Government Procurement
- Other local authorities
- Other public bodies
- Revenue Commissioners
- Road Management Office
- S Transport Infrastructure Ireland
- Valuer of property or land (for example, as part of a compulsory purchase order)
- Vehicle Registration Unit.
