### Longford County Council adopted over €57.2m Budget 2021

On Monday 23rd November, Longford County Council adopted a Revenue Budget of over €57.2m, this represents an increase of nearly 20% on the previous year's budget of €48m. What makes it even more remarkable is that it was achieved in the most challenging environment experienced in the sector in memory. Together with a range of welcome supports from Central Government, prudent decisions taken at a local level and a collaborative determination between the Elected Members and the Management Team the value of the approach developed and adopted in Longford cannot be understated. We have managed to frame a Budget that enables Longford County Council to not only cope with and survive the current challenges, but will also help us to thrive and maximise any post COVID buoyancy that might arise in the better times ahead. 



## Longford Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

The next meeting of the Local Community Development Committee is scheduled to take place on Tuesday the 8th December 2020.

The last meeting of the LCDC was held on 10th November 2020. Cllr. Colm Murray was selected as the new Chairperson, while Cllr. Seamus Butler was selected as Vice-Chairperson.

At the LCDC meeting on 10th November 2020, 6 LEADER projects were approved for funding totalling €665,636.63.

#### Community Grant Support Scheme 2021

The Longford County Council Community Grant Support Scheme for 2021 is now open for applications. The scheme was advertised in the Longford Leader dated Friday 13th November 2020.

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Comhairle na nÓg Capital Grant for ICT Hardware Funding of €2,554.99 was secured from the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEDIY) for ICT hardware to support the development and implementation of a blended and in person approach, in the delivery of the Comhairle na nÓg. This funding will enable a potential increase in the number of young people who can participate and improve the reach and retention of Comhairle members.

#### Longford Comhairle na nÓg AGM 2020

On Friday the 13th of November, Cathaoirleach of Longford County Council Paul Ross opened Longford Comhairle na nÓg AGM. The event was held via Zoom with 65 youth participants representing all post primary schools and youth services in the County. The theme was "Although Apart, Technically Together". Workshops took place in break out rooms and the topic for discussion was "Covid-19 and the world we live in today". The findings were recorded using group map software, which participants completed during the workshop. Two guest speakers discussed the issues of physical health and mindfulness with an emphasis on developing positive mental health strategies. The closing address was delivered by Councillor Colm Murray Chairperson of Longford Comhairle na nÓg Steering Committee.

#### Playgrounds

The children's play adventure trail in the Albert Reynolds Peace Park The Mall has been refurbished with the introduction of new equipment. This project was part funded by the Dept of Children and Youth Affairs The Adult gym equipment in the Fair Green in Edgeworthstown has been replaced and refurbished this project was funded by the Healthy Ireland fund.

#### Longford Sports Partnership

#### 4 X 4 Walking Challenge:

Longford Sports Partnership and Longford GAA want to help bring people in Longford together virtually anyway to improve their physical and mental health as part of the Keep Well Campaign. So, we have set the people of Longford the 4 FOR 4 Parish Walking Challenge. Our 4FOR4 challenge is encouraging the people of your parish to complete 4 walks each week of 4k distance for 4 weeks from Monday the 23rd of November to Sunday the 20th of December. After 3 days we had 733 walkers signed up and 6345km already walked, really looking forward to seeing what the end results are.

#### COVID- 19 Small Grant Scheme:

Longford Sports Partnership managed the Small Club COVID-19 Grant fund on behalf of Sport Ireland for sports clubs in Longford and we were successful in being awarded €40,422 in funding for clubs. In total 39 clubs in Longford will benefit from this funding, club names listed on website. This is a welcome boost to clubs who have had to make significant investment to make sure their sport is as safe as possible. We have also been successful in obtaining a further €12,000 to support our communities through this difficult time.

#### Your Personal Best Month:

Is an exciting project encouraging men to stop making excuses and to engage in 30 minutes of moderate physical activity five days a week. The campaign is also being supported by the nationwide network of Local Sport Partnerships, who will provide practical support on the ground with resources available at www. sportireland.ie. Longford Sports Partnership are delighted to support this campaign in Longford and encourage Men around the county to get involved. It fits into the Keep Active section of the government Keep Well Campaign. #### Health & Safety

Following the Government's announcement in October the whole country moved to Level 5 of the Framework for Living with COVID-19. As providers of essential services, Longford County Council put in place the following measures to comply with Level 5 restrictions:

- Meetings and visits to the Council offices were by 'by appointment only'.
- Services were provided online or by appointment only.
- Plans were put in place to extend the Community Call service.
- There was increased focus on resilience and wellbeing, requiring our Libraries, Arts Office, Creative Ireland, Heritage and Archives, Healthy Ireland and Sports Partnership to develop programmes to support our citizens and communities.
- Dog and horse control operated a callout service only
- Activity relating to anti-social behaviour operated on emergency and callout basis only.
- Rent collectors did not call to houses
- Maintenance work on housing stock only take place in emergency situations.
- Rental inspections took place if a house was vacant.
- The swimming pool and leisure centre closed.
- SOGs were reviewed by the LGMA and updated to reflect the new Level 5 restrictions.
- Statutory Council meeting could be facilitated remotely

#### Local Enterprise Office

The LEO office continues to roll out the #ShopLongford Campaign encouraging people to shop local this Christmas. Shop Local has become a significant part of the governments messaging this year to try and support hard pressed retailers who have suffered most during this Pandemic.

The campaign is run over the LEO's social media channels and has been well supported by the retail sector locally and by the different Trade Associations in the County.

In addition our Cathaoirleach Cllr. Paul Ross has produced an amazing video as part of the #ShopLongford Campaign that really brings to life the faces and personalities behind our local shops and businesses. The video is a county wide look at our retail sector and highlights the wide range of products and services that can be bought locally this Christmas. Th is our Cathaoirleach's second video during the course of the Pandemic and there are rumours that he has appointed an agent to handle the large demand for his services.

The video can be viewed on Longford County Council's youtube and social media platforms.



To support business to trade on line the LEO off has this year approved 117 small businesses with a Trading on Line voucher at a cost of €227,000. The majority of these business es should be able to handle on-line enquiries in time for the Christmas Season.

**Tourism Office** 



Longford Tourism in collaboration with the Heritage & Archivist services are currently working with a start up company from Carrick-On-Shannon called EZxploring. EZxploring are commissioned to do a EZxploring Heritage trail for 5 County Longford Towns, namely, Granard, Edgeworthstown, Longford, Lanesborough and Ballymahon. This is an new exciting initiative with County Longford being the first County to work with this brand. Look forward to doing an EZxploring trail in County Longford in 2021.

### Longford County Library Heritage and Archive

#### Edgeworthstown Community Library

Work continues to progress well on this project.
Windows have just been installed and work has
commenced on the plaza at the entrance to the library.

#### Longford County Library Service:

The library has had to close its doors during phase 5 but it continues to connect with its customers by telephone, email and through its broad range of online services: ebooks, eaudio books, online newspapers, language learning and much more. The housebound service for older people has been reactivated and the schools are being supported through block loans of class novels, Zoom and teams workshops, literary competitions etc. An extensive online programme of events to engage adults particularly those who are isolated or living alone is being developed. Basic Digital Skills training tailored to individual needs is running on a pilot basis with members of Longford OPC.



#### Longford Age Friendly Programme

Keeping people connected!: The strong focus of this programme throughout Covid19 was on keeping our older citizens connected and minding their mental health and wellbeing. Over 400 Information packs promoting all the services available to our older citizens have been distributed around the county and through Family Resource Centres by Longford Civil Defense. A full online programme of events has been developed with the most popular being the Music and Singing, Gardening, Art and Cookery.

#### Creative Ireland

Most of the planned annual programme has been completed and a number of additional projects under the Keep Well programme. These creative projects have been run in partnership with the Family Resource Centres and Backstage Theatre.

A local Community Television studio which is mobile has been set up with a view to involving all ages in making their own local programmes.

#### Longford Decade of Centenaries programme

History Month in November was a great success, with five recordings local events 100 years ago going live during the month. As of now, there have been about 2,800 views in total. The conference on 14 November was also very successful, with 61 people joining-in, including a number from outside Longford. There is one further recording in preparation: to commemorate the burning of parts of Ballinalee in mid-December 1920.


#### Recruitment


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



#### Rural Working Hubs Webinar

On 24 November 2020 the Regeneration Department, with our project partners in Leader Aisapari in Finland held a very successful webinar to discuss rural working hubs with over ninety participants taking part from across Ireland, Finland and Europe. Among the speakers from Ireland and Finland were Minister Robert Troy, Tracy Keogh, co-founder of Grow Remote Ireland and Stephen Carolan, Western Development Commission. The discussion provided participants with an insight into the policy context, strategic approach and good practices in the development of rural working hubs, as well as practical experience from a community perspective. We hope that by sharing best practice, both nationally and internationally, we will help to develop a network of hubs across the county that will allow people to have a healthier work life balance and help to regenerate our towns and villages.

#### World Urbanism Day

Each November World Urbanism Day is celebrated in 30 countries on four continents. It is a special day to promote the role of planning in creating liveable communities. Longford URBACT Local group and the Regeneration team work together in support of sustainable social, economic and environmental development in urban and rural areas throughout County Longford. We continue to engage with EU networks to develop, learn and ensure our projects are aligned with best planning practice.

#### The Mall Walk, Longford town

Upgrade works which include fencing, street lighting and tarmacadam to upgrade the surface has completed on the entrance trail from St Johns Church Battery Road to The Albert Reynolds Peace Park in Longford town. Due to its proximity to the town centre and accessibility, the area is very popular for walking and running, as well as those involved in organised sports. These enhancement works to the existing trail which is 2.6kms approx. in length will be greatly welcomed by the many users of this facility.

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#### Housing

- The Summary of Social Housing Assessment was completed this month, the purpose was to capture the total number of households qualified for social housing support across the county whose social housing need is not being met, in order to understand the level of need for such support. Nearly 300 qualified households were reviewed to ensure that they still want and qualify for support, and to ensure that the detail of the applicants' household is up to date and accurate.
- The Homeless Action Team met this month; the focus of this interagency group is to discuss the needs of homeless people and put in place support services to enable them to secure accommodation and tenancy sustainment.
- Our Housing Liaison Officer attended a Virtual meeting of the Intercultural Hub of the Longford Community Resources clg (LCRL) in which she discussed her job role within the Housing Department and provided details on the Housing application process and housing options available. There was also a lengthy Q&A session in which our Housing Liaison Officer answered any queries posed by 50+ participants.

- The Housing Section have recently allocated a property under The Choice Based Letting Scheme at 7 Greville Court, Granard, Co. Longford. Choice Based Letting (CBL) is a method that can be used for the allocation of Social Housing which is designed to offer more choice and involvement for applicant households in selecting a new home.
- Works are progressing well on a number of projects on site currently including: 6 OPDs at Rose Cottage, Ballinalee; 1 no. unit, Fairgreen View, Longford and 1 no unit Cloonahard, Longford. The 5 no. units, Church Street, Edgeworthstown, the 18 /22 units at Legan and 16 no. units at Farnagh Hill, Longford will be completed in early December.

#### Roads

In Longford Town, work on the N63 Market Square to Flancare Scheme is continuing.

Pavement works at Market Square and Harbour Row are progressing well.

Works funded under the 2020 Regional and Local Road Grant Allocations were completed in each Municipal District.

Routine Works such as Street Cleaning, Hedge Cutting, Pothole Repair, Drainage works etc also continued in each Municipal District.

Construction Works Active Travel Measures Schemes and Climate Change Adaptions Schemes continued during November in each of the Municipal Districts.

An Active Travel Scheme in Granard involved narrowing of the road and widening of the foot/cycle path on the approach to Ardscoil Padraig on the R194. This area has a history of high speed traffic within a 60kph zone on the approach to a Secondary School. The objective of this scheme is to facilitate pedestrians and cyclists using the shared surface of a new wider path and at the same time narrow the road to promote slower traffic approach speed to the Secondary School area.

#### **Water Services**

The business continuity of the Water Service section is considered to be of significant priority for both the county and the state at the present time while Longford County Council continues to plan and deliver the functions of the Water Services section throughout the county.

The Water Services Capital section continue to provide services during the current COVID-19 pandemic in terms of ensuring continuation of service of drinking water for the County particularly in areas with headroom/supply issues.

#### Capital Network Schemes

Irish Water in partnership with Longford County Council have recently commenced the installation of approximately 1400m of new watermain to replace the existing old problematic watermain at Ballymakeegan and will shortly commence the installation of a new watermain and connections to Templemichael Terrace, Longford. Both schemes will improve the water network and security of supply in these areas.



#### Flow Meter Stimulus Works

Water Services Capital section have recently secured funding for the installation of reservoir inlet flow meters at four of our reservoir sites in County Longford. These works will enable accurate recording of water flows from the water treatment plants into the reservoirs and network which will greatly aid with leakage management of the water distribution system.

Works are currently progressing well and the photo below shows new inlet flow meter being installed at the Edenmore Lower reservoir recently:



#### Pressure Management Improvement works

Water Services Capital section have recently secured funding for pressure reduction improvement works and have identified two sites which will benefit from pressure reduction at Gelsha & Granardkill. Funding has been secured to replace two problematic pressure reducing valves (PRV's) in the network which when completed will aid pressure management of the water network and improve access to the PRV's for future maintenance works.

#### **ECI Water Programme**

Irish Water in consultation with Longford County Council has recently commenced the ECI (Early Contractor Involvement) Programme in County Longford. This is a national programme aimed at carrying out appropriate improvement works at water treatment plants throughout the country to ensure the continued delivery of safe drinking water. To date Irish Water have assessed over 811 sites and completed upgrade works to over 230 sites.

The programme is currently at detail design and planning stage for the Lough Forbes WTP while works are progressing well at Lough Kinale (Granard) WTP and Lough Gowna (Smear) WTP.
