Community Development

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

A meeting of the LCDC took place on Tuesday, 9 November.

LEADER

Two LEADER projects were approved for funding of over €137,039 at the LCDC meeting in November.

New Community Activities Fund

On 11 November, Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, and Minister of State with responsibility for Community Development and Charities, Joe O'Brien TD launched this new scheme to support community and voluntary groups impacted by COVID-19.

This one-off fund is to be allocated under the Department's Community Enhancement Programme and it will be administered locally by the Local Community Development Committees (LCDCs). €264,769 has been allocated to Longford LCDC.

- The Community Activities Fund will support groups, particularly in disadvantaged areas, with their running costs such as utility (for example, electricity or heating charges) or insurance bills, as well as with improvements to their facilities.
- Groups will also be able to use the funding to carry out necessary repairs and to purchase equipment such as tables and chairs, tools and signage, laptops and printers, lawnmowers, canopies and training equipment.

Further information including details of how to make an application will be provided. Similar to the Community Enhancement Programme, the funding has been allocated to each local authority area based on deprivation and population levels.

Intercultural Working Group

Work continues with community groups in providing support from the intercultural fund to engage with new communities. Support was provided to Longford Women's Link to work with a migrant women's group shown here on a trip to Dublin Zoo.

Support was also provided to Lus na Gréine Family Resource Centre to run a variety of activities including craft classes to encourage various cultures to come together to mix and learn new skills.

Comhairle na nÓg 2021 AGM

Cathaoirleach Cllr Peggy Nolan opened the event which took place online on Friday, 12 November. The AGM was a huge success with 71 young people representing all nine post primary schools and youth services from across the county. Discussions were held on many topics pre-selected by the young people. Minister Roderic O'Gorman addressed the event in a pre-recorded message and guest speaker Lindsay Bennett delivered an inspirational speech on her journey of strength and gratitude.

LGBTI Dormant Accounts Funding

Funding of €21,500 was successfully secured following an application submitted to the Department of Rural and Community Development to run specific projects in 2022.

Pilot Community Development Programme for County Longford

The Department of Rural and Community Development allocated €125,000 to the Council to administer to Longford Community Resources Clg (LCRL) under the guidance of the LCDC.

This programme will put in place a community development project managed and run by members of Roma and new communities. This aims to engage people directly with decision-making structures and to work in partnership with service providers and other agencies.

Tourism



The Royal Canal Greenway has been shortlisted in the All Ireland Community and Council Awards as one of the Best Tourism Initiatives in 2021, and will go forward to the final.

The 2021 Awards Ceremony, which is presented by the Local Authority Members Association (LAMA) will now take place in April 2022.

The enchanting Royal Canal Greenway is 130K of level towpath, ideal for walkers, runners and cyclists of all ages and fitness levels. Starting in cosmopolitan Maynooth, it follows the 200 year old canal through friendly Enfield and lively Mullingar, to charming Cloondara in Longford, with cafés, picnic spots and attractions along the way.

Rustic and industrial landscapes combine, with rolling fields, pretty waterside villages, working locks and historic landmarks.

County Longford is one of four counties along the Royal Canal Greenway along with counties Westmeath, Meath and Kildare.

Edgeworthstown Community Library is open!



The beautiful interior of the new Edgeworthstown Community Library is airy and filled with light, with the latest technology at your fingertips.

The new community library in Edgeworthstown opened its doors to the public for the first time on Monday 22 November - an historic and joyful day for the town.

Unfortunately due to public health guidelines, Minister for Rural and Community Development Heather Humphreys TD was unable to officially open the library, with this visit has been postponed to a later date. Cathaoirleach Cllr Peggy Nolan cut the ribbon on the new library in a scaled back opening ceremony.

From the moment the doors opened, customers have been streaming through the library every day, with many members of the public joining their library for the first time. The library also hosted its first book launch witha book on Maria Edgeworth. All proceeds were donated to the local Edgeworth Society.

Longford Age Friendly programme

Longford Age Friendly programme has focused on keeping our older citizens connected and supporting their mental health and wellbeing throughout the COVID-19 crisis. Aligned to this, a Positive Ageing Information Day was hosted by Longford Age Friendly Alliance in November at Longford Rugby Club, officially launched by Cathaoirleach Cllr Peggy Nolan.

Ninety-five older people from across the county attended, including members of Active Age groups, Day Care Centres and Family Resource Centres. All service providers who work with older people attended, giving updates on their services. These included the HSE, Gardaí, Longford Community Resources, Alone and Age Action. Also included were sections from the local authority including Housing, Sports Partnership, Library, and Public Participation Network.

Archives Digitisation

The Jude Flynn Collection (a collection of 524 cassette tapes) is being digitised at present. The archives relating to the Irish Revolution (1912-23) are also being digitised.

Decade of Centenaries

The schools' resource pack entitled "Ireland and Longford in Times of War and Revolution 1914-23" has been distributed to all primary and secondary schools in the county.

A one-day online conference was held on 6 November to mark the centenary of the Clonfin ambush. A free supplement commemorating the War of Independence in County Longford was distributed in the Longford Leader on 19 November.

Longford Live & Local winter programme got underway

Longford Live & Local winter programme is the second phase of the very successful summer programme which saw many concerts and arts inititaives take place throughout the county earlier this year. This winter version was officially launched on 22 November.

For winter's Longford Live & Local, Longford County Council has been awarded a grant of €143,000. This will be used to engage local artists, musicians and creative communities for delivering a wide variety of performance and cultural events throughout November and December.



Events are coordinated by the Longford Creative Ireland programme, supported by local Events Manager Shane Crossan and Republic of Culture. Over 67 live cultural events will take place in towns and villages around County Longford. All events will be strictly managed observing COVID-19 public health guidelines, with a number of events streamed live to online audiences.

Heritage

Community-based archaeological conservation management plans have been advanced for key archaeological sites. Works fall under the Community Monuments Fund and include the repair of the Tower House at Abbeyshrule Abbey and the conservation assessment of the monastery at Saints Island.



Conservation guides have been developmed for the motte-and-bailey castle at Granard which is known as the 'Moat of Granard'. This work has been done with help from the National Monuments Service and the Office of Public Works.

Inclusive Athletics

Longford Sports Partnership have been working with Longford Athletics Club on their first inclusive athletics training sessions. Two groups of children and young people meet on Friday evenings for an opportunity to try athletics activities. A huge success, this programme will continue to be offered into the future.

Socia-Ball, a new women's basketball initiative emphasising fun, participation and fitness is being offered by Longford Phoenix Basketball Club, supported by Longford Sports Partnership.



Highly-social and fun in nature, women will learn the key basketball skills and play in a supportive environment, without the pressure of competition.

This four-week programme is aimed at beginners as well as those with previous experience. It is an ideal opportunity to revisit basketball or try it for the first time, all while making new friends along the way.

Men on the Move - Kenagh

Men on the Move, a physical activity programme aimed at men who have been away from sport and exercise for a prolonged period of time, has stated its second group in Kenagh this month.

This 12-week programme offers men an excellent chance to get active again. Participants should expect to see increases to their fitness levels. They can also expect improvements in their overall health and well-being, as well as plenty of friends being made along the way!





Contract signing at Abbeyshrule

Contracts have been signed with Doyle Construction Limited for the redevelopment of the Old Canal Stores in Abbeyshrule into a new rural working hub. Work has already commenced. The project will offer a mix of offices and co-working spaces, as well as a purpose-built unit for Abbeyshrule Canoe Club.

Aligned to the national Our Rural Future: Rural Development Policy, this project is an excellent example of bringing vacant and derelict buildings back into active use, creating space for economic development in communities in Longford.



NOAC Good Practice in Local Government Awards

Regeneration and IT presented a video on the Rural Working Hubs Strategy and Digital Strategy at the National Oversight and Audit Commission (NOAC) Good Practice in Local Government Awards.

The first Irish local authority to develop a Rural Working Hubs Strategy, addresses the 3,300 plus

workers traveling outside the county for work (Census 2016). It aims to provide an opportunity to work within the local community, preventing the loss of economic and social activity.

Longford Connected project contract signing

Work is progressing on the €4m Urban Regeneration and Development Fund (URDF) Longford Connected project in Longford town.

The St Mel's Road section of the project will be substantially completed by December. On completion, works will improve accessibility, appearance and pedestrian amenity along this route linking Albert Reynolds Peace Park, St Michael's School, Longford Shopping Centre and St Mel's Cathedral.

Additionally, the construction contract for the public areas at Longford Shopping Centre and Market Square was awarded to P&D Lydon. Work is expected to start in early-2022.

Antisocial Behaviour Strategy

The Antisocial Behaviour Strategy is due for renewal in 2022, coinciding with the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP), Age Friendly Strategy and Integration Strategy all due for renewal next year.

For this Antisocial Behaviour Strategy, the Estate Manager, with the Community Safety Coordinator and Regeneration, are exploring the possibility of developing an internal group to share information and work together.

Additionally, while the new Local Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) is at research stage, the feedback from its consultations can be utilised to form action plans which can be incorporated into the Antisocial Bahaviour Strategy. For this, consultation with community Gardaí is ongoing, with the overall objective to create a safe community.

Residents Associations

The Housing Liaison Officer is currently working with for local authority estates to help set up new residents associations.

Work is also taking place with MacEoin Park residents to establish a pilot Residents Working Group, supported by the Council.

In lieu of the annual competition or award ceremony, Housing have awarded a bonus payment to the existing groups to encourage groups to take pride in their estates.

Housing projects

Work is ongoing on the following:

- 6 units Rose Cottage, Ballinalee
- 6 remaining units Campbells Lane
- 14 units O'Haras site, Richmond Street
- 11 units at Alder field, Farnagh

Refurbished Voids

- Vacant properties refurbished to date: 30
- These properities were refurbished under the Voids Programme 2021, with these properties brought back into social housing stock for tenants.

Roads

Roadworks Programme

Works on Active Travel Schemes, Community Involvement Schemes and Safety Improvement Schemes are continuing in each Municipal District (MD).

Drainage and Bridge Works are also ongoing in the MDs, and the three-year Roads Programme for 2022-2024 has also been submitted to the Department of Transport.

National Road Schemes.

- Newtownforbes Pavement Resurfacing Scheme is progressing, with completion due in the next few weeks
- The N63 Majors Well Road project is ongoing, with the contractor Priority Construction.
 Footpath and drainage works will be progressed over the coming weeks.

Local Improvement Scheme

The Local Improvement Scheme provides funding to help local authorities carry out improvement works on private and non-publicly maintained roads. Funding is provided by the Department of Rural and Community Development. €393,041 was allocated to Longford County Council in 2021, allowing the Council to complete works on 14 Local Improvement Schemes across the county.

Road Safety

Irish Road Safety Week which ran in October and was a major success, with local schools taking part in road safety activities and competitions run by the Local Authority Road Safety Officer.

In November, road safety goodie bags and spot prizes were awarded to all who took part.

Water Services

Find & Fix Programme

Longford County Council Find & Fix team are operating in the Prucklish, Clooncoose and Longford Town-West District Metered Areas (DMAs). The team fixed a substantial leak in the Clonbalt area of Longford, saving approximately 96,000 litres of drinking water per day.

Longford to Lanesborough Network Upgrade

Water Services Capital Section are liaising with Irish Water in identifying and delivering network upgrades to enable water supply from Longford Central Supply Zone to the Lanesborough Supply Zone.

This work includes the design and installation of a pump station and other necessary infrastructural works. It will improve the resilience of the water network and provide security of supply to the Lanesborough area.

Capital Network Schemes

Water Services Capital section are currently liaising with Irish Water to progress three capital network rehabilitation schemes:

- Cahanagh-Prucklish: replacement of c.400 l/m of problematic watermain between Cahanagh Cross and Prucklish (along the R198). This project has been substantially completed and the new watermain has been commissioned.
- Rathcline Road, Lanesborough: replacement of

approximately 2.5km of problematic watermain between Lanesborough and Carrowroe reservoir

• Creevy, Granard: replacement of approximately 500 metres of problematic watermain

These works ensure security of supply and contribute to reducing leakage. These works are funded by Irish Water's National Leakage Reduction Programme.

2021 Pressure Management Works

Water Services have recently completed the repair and replacement of 8 pressure reducing valves (PRVs). This will help maintain and improve the existing water supply network. Works were installed by Longford County Council Water Section and completed at the end of November.

Planning

Longford Town Plan

Work is ongoing on the review of the Longford Town Plan to include a Transport Study, Affordable Housing, Climate Change, Active Travel and co-ordinating various development projects. Public Consultation will start early-2022, with Town Plan to be adopted early-2023.



Applications and Enforcement

Planning application systems fully operational. Public counter are open to accept planning applications. Pre-Planning meetings available online.

Statutory requirements maintained:

- Managing the various planning applications, housing, retail, industrial proposals, Section 284 license applications for outdoor seating and broadband, Part 8 planning schemes, CPOs, and enforcement
- Planning administrative office, public counter and technical advice and reports kept fully functioning
- Assisting in the implementation of the housing, regeneration and climate change programme

County Development Plan

Longford County Development Plan 2021-2027, adopted in October, came into effect on 30 November. Work is ongoing to amend the final document, as required and publishing the plan.

Operations

- Five personnel attended three-day chainsaw refresher training held in Edgeworthstown.
- A one-day road traffic collision and electric vehicle extrication courses took place in Longford, Granard and Edgeworthstown, with 29 personnel attending

Equipment

- Capital funding was secured for road traffic collision cutting equipment, a thermal imaging camera and six specialist fire blankets to deal with fires in hybrid and electric vehicles
- Capital funding was also secured for road traffic collision van and fit out
- Annual service completed on pumps, ladders, road traffic collision equipment and winches

Duties & Taskings

Civil Defence provided medical cover at the following local and community events:

- One Longford Town Soccer match
- Two Longford Live & Local events



Training and Operations

- Induction and critical incident stress management training took place for probationary volunteers. Risk assessments and policies and procedures were also communicated.
- Two emergency medical technician (EMT) students are continuing their training
- Water awareness training was completed
- One volunteer passed the C1 vehicle licence test
- Transport was provided to elderly persons for their COVID-19 booster vaccinations
- One 4X4 vehicle has been purchased following a tender process. Funding was provided by the Department of Defence under the Dormant Accounts Fund. This vehicle is now being readied for inclusion in the fleet.
- Statutory inspection of equipment was carried out

Climate Action Initiatives

Regeneration

- Remote working facilities currently being developed in Abbeyshrule will aim to encourage workers to stay close to home for work. This will avoid long commutes, with less emissions from vehicle use benefiting the environment.
- Development and maintenance of walkway trails throughout the county will encourage people to walk or cycle instead of using cars and other vehicles, again reducing emissions.

Information Technology

- Several paperless projects are progressing which will have an instant positive impact on the organisation's carbon footprint. This includes the eCorporate Planning app which is now live. The ePMDS app will be launched shortly also. Each app will see a significant reduction in paper, printing and energy usage on a per employee basis
- Work has started with Community and Enterprise to facilitate a paperless community grants

Housing

- Part of the Midlands Retrofit Programme, work is ongoing on the retrofitting of four council estates in Ballinalee. The River Crescent and Camlin View are now completed, while Cois na hAbhainn and Hill View are on-going
- Additionally, the tender is in progress for St Matthews Park in Ballymahon and an assessment of the works required are being considered on the 46 local authority houses around the county
- Under the National Energy Efficiency Programme, work has commenced on the retrofitting of 20 houses at Sli na Mona in Ballymahon

Roads

- Roads are now fully in charge of 5,729 public lights. With proactive upgrading, 3,563 of these public lights are now more engergy efficient LEDs. This is an increase of 293 LEDs since April this year.
- The remaining 2,166 public lights will be upgraded over the next few years

Planning

- Working with Environment, Planning is preparing a town forestry proposal and preliminary work on a Longford carbon neutral town initiative
- The Development Plan Review includes a specific chapter on climate change, with all chapters also haveing a climate change checklist at the end
- Following the adoption of the County Plan, consideration is being given to drawing up climate change actions in the county. This will include work on active travel for Longford rown and preparing the application for the Lough Ree UNESCO biosphere proposal.

Fire Services

- The new fire engine ordered for Longford Fire Service will be provided with a plastic body which will be recycleable and reusable
- This vehicle will also be provided with ad blue, which will help to give out cleaner fuel emissions
