Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) A meeting of the LCDC took place on 12 October.

### LEADER

Seven LEADER projects were approved for funding of over €509,358 at the LCDC meeting in October.

### Intercultural Fund

COVID-19 severely impacted children's ability to interact and participate in activities. To encourage children and their families to come together, while also promoting intercultural activity, Melview Football Club held a tournament over two weekends back in August. Eight Longford clubs and 40 teams participated, with over 400 children taking part.

Following on from this, under the Intercultural Fund €3,000 was allocated to an intercultural community Halloween event in Ballymahon. Hosted by Ballymahon Town Team. It brought together the community and helped reduce anti-social behaviour around Halloween for the enjoyment of everyone. The event included a controlled wood-only bonfire, fireworks display, live entertainment, and snacks.

### Decade of Commemorations


Planning work took place for History Month happening in November. A free Longford Leader supplement was researched and prepared, with publication mid-November. An online conference entitled '1921: Partition, Truce and Treaty', with a distinguished panel of speakers was prepared and will take place on 6 November.

#### Edgeworthstown Library

Edgeworthstown Community Library is progressing well, with the official opening set to take place on 19 November with Minister for Rural and Community Development Heather Humphries TD in attendance.

### Longford County Library Service

All services to the public are restored, with the exception of My Open Library. Longford, Granard and Ballymahon libraries hosted three launches of Longford's Republican Story 1900-2000, a new book by local historian Seán Ó Súilleabháin. All were well-attended, while adhering to public health guidelines.



### Heritage Office

Work continues on the County Heritage Plan projects. Work has also commenced on the Community Monuments Fund project on Rossduff Castle and on the Abbeyshrule Abbey.

### The Fabulously True and Timeless Tales of Sergeant Virgil

Following on from the summer's successful Longford Live & Local and Faoin Spéir events, The Fabulously True and Timeless Tales of Sergeant Virgil, an outdoor arts preformance looking at the social history of the Camlin quarter took place between 22-24 October.

### Local Sports Partnership

#### Sports Bursary Awards

Longford County Council through Longford Sports Partnership announced the Longford County Council Sports Bursary for 2021 in October.

The Council has allocated €5,000 towards this Bursary. Awards will go to individual sports people who have shown ability in their sport and possess the potential to achieve excellence at national and international level.

#### **Buggy Walks**

Buggy Walks, a series of social walks taking place across the county for parents, grandparents, childminders and others in the care of babies and toddlers, started in October. The walks take place every Tuesday in Longford, Wednesday in Ballymahon and Thursdays in Granard, at 11am-12pm in all locations until 25 November.

Buggy Walks is a partnership between Longford Westmeath Children and Young People's Services Committee (CYPSC), Longford Sports Partnership and Westmeath Sports Partnership.

#### Pulmonary Rehab Exercise Programme

Longford Sports Partnership and the Health Service Executive (HSE) Respiratory Integrated Care Service (Longford Westmeath) have teamed up to provide a Pulmonary Rehab Exercise Programme.

Before starting, all participants were screened by a physiotherapist and cleared to take part. All participants also previously completed a Pulmonary Rehab

Programme with HSE physiotherapists, before this follow-up community-based programme.

For this exercise-based programme, Longford Sports Partnership provided an exercise tutor, exercise programme and venue. Working is ongoing to support participants to form a club and become self-sustaining.

### Club Development Grant

October also saw the opening of the Club Development Grant 2021 for applications. These Grants aim to support initiatives from sports and physical activity clubs across County Longford. The maxiumum grant available is €500. Closes for applications at 4pm, 10 November.

### Healthy Communities Enhancement Funding Scheme

Healthy Communities Enhancement Funding Scheme supports projects positively impacting residents' health and wellbeing. Under this Scheme, Longford County Council will receive €250,000 in funding for a proposal developed from the Regeneration team.

The proposed development is for Ballyminion within the Longford Rural Electoral Division (ED). It will connect and serve disadvantaged areas within the Longford Urban EDs. Ballyminion is located south-west of Longford town, linking the N5 Strokestown road and N63 Athlone road. The project aims to serve these areas with:

- Cycleways installation and enhanced pedestrian connections, including public lighting, road crossings and environmental improvements, between Ballyminion's medicial centre to Flancare link road
- Cyclelane installation in addition to Active Travel proposals on the N63

Works will link the Royal Canal and the Mid Shannon Wilderness Park Greenways at the Strokestown Road, serving Farranyoogan and Gleann Riada Housing Estates.

### Health & Safety

#### Safety Inspections

There were five Safety Inspections completed by the Health and Safety section and the Management Team.

#### External Surveillance Audit

Longford County Council's external surveillance audit of the Safety Management System took place on 5-6 October, with the successful retention of our ISO 45001:2018 accreditation.

The audit was undertaken by the National Standards Authority of Ireland (NSAI), by two auditors over two-days. This year's audit focused on the council's high-risk areas of the following sections: Fire Services, Building Facilities, Roads and Water Services. This was the first year Fire Services were included, meaning all sections within the Council are now included in the scope of this audit.

The audit had a very positive outcome, with the previously mentioned retention of the ISO 45001:2018 accreditation. At the closing meeting, the auditors also highlighted the Council's strenghts, including employee engagement and active participation. This closing meeting was held online, with 104 employees attending.

Management and Health and Safety thank all sections who took part in the audit and those who attended at the closing meeting. The audit could not happen and be so successful without the knowledge and engagement of employees in the safety management system.

#### Streetscape Enhancement Measure

The Department of Rural and Community Development has extended the date for completion of works to 31 December due to a contractor shortage and potential weather-related delays. It was also agreed to offer a level of autonomy to Local Authorities in exceptional cases where works are delayed due to lack of contractors. These exceptional cases have until 31 May 2022 to complete works, once agreed with their Local Authority.

Longford County Council has also been allocated additional funding, raising the Streetscape Enhancement Measure budget to €236,800. This additional funding will increase funding to projects who received less than originally applied for in their initial offers. It is also intended to issue funding to applicants who missed the initial deadline or who declined their offer due to the short timeframe, prior to the extension now given.







### Regeneration

Rural Working Hubs Strategy Shortlisted for Prestigious Awards Regeneration's Rural Working Hub Strategy and Guidance Document has recently been shortlisted for two separate awards: the Local Authority Innovation Category at the Chambers Ireland Excellence in Local Government Awards 2021, and the Economy category at the European Innovation in Politics Awards 2021.



The latter recognises innovative projects based on European values of social balance, democracy, and human rights. Longford County Council joins five finalists from Ireland, helping make up the 90 shortlisted projects across nine categories. The winners will be announced in December. Old Bog Line, Culray in Aughnacliffe The Old Bog Line, Culray in Aughnacliffe project involved developing a historic walking trail of approximately 500m. Part of this projected included the development of a bog access roadway, which had become overgrown in recent years. This trail now links to the other recreational amenities, including Lough Gowna's Dring carpark and Derrycassin Woods walking trail.

This development makes up the first phase of a larger project which will link up with approximately one kilometre of bogland at the Old Bog Line: a throughway road built in famine times from Granard to Arva and onto Cavan.

#### Red Bridge Ballymahon

Coordinated by Waterways Ireland in cooperation with Longford County Council, the Red Bridge project has recently been completed. This involved the installation of a floating jetty at the Red Bridge on the River Inny at Shrule, as well as construction of a car park and installation of new solar powered lighting. It is a welcome enhancement of the tourism infrastructure in County Longford. The Red Bridge is also one of many projects to develop new and enhanced waterside amenities and enable infrastructure at different locations along the Shannon Navigation.

### Commons North Walk Upgrade, Lanesborough

The Commons North Walk upgrade in Lanesborough focused on the maintenance and upgrading of an existing walkway of approximately 800m. This project involved clearing overgrowth, raising the ground above flood-level and protecting the trail against future flooding.

Located close to Lanesborough village centre, the walk forms part of the area's tourism offering. It also links the village with the countryside through forestry, punctuated with glimpses of Lough Ree.

Since completion, Longford County Council has received very positive feedback, especially relating to the increased accessibility and the contribution the walkway now makes to the local amenity infrastructure.



## Strategic Infastructure & Climate Action

### Housing

#### Social Housing Assessment

The Summary of Social Housing Assessment is underway, with the purpose of capturing the total number of households who qualified for social housing support across the county and whose social housing need is not currently being met. This will help to understand the level of need for such support. Over 80 qualified households whom are not currently in receipt of social housing support are being reviewed to ensure that they still want and qualify for support, and to ensure that the detail of the applicants' household is up to date and accurate.

Members of Longford County Council Local Traveller Accommodation Consultive Committe (LTACC) are currently engaging in shared training to build momentum behind the work of the LTACC. Three two-hour sessions are being facilitated to explore and agree on the: LTACC potential; LTACC process; and LTACC commitment. The facilitator will draft a guidance document for the ongoing work of the LTACC.

At the end of September, the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage notified Longford County Council of the Social Housing Delivery targets. These targets have been developed based on recent social housing waiting lists and data obtained from our Social Housing Assessment.

### Roads

#### Roadworks Programme

Work on Local Improvement Schemes, Community Involvement Schemes and Climate Change Adaption and Resilience Schemes is continuing in each municipal district (MD). Drainage and bridge works are also ongoing in the various MDs.

A three year roads programme is currently being prepared for 2022- 2024 and these programmes were presented for approval at special October municipal district meetings before being submitted to the Department of Transport.

#### National Road Schemes.

- Works complete on N63 Barnacor Pavement Resurfacing Scheme, involving drainage, verge banking, pavement resurfacing and strengthening, tree removal, lining, road studs and associated works on a 1,200m stretch
- Newtownforbes Pavement Resurfacing Scheme is progressing, due to be completed in November
- The N63 Majors Well Road project has started and will take approximately six months. Priority Construction is the contractor.
- Work on the N63 in Lanesborough starts next February, with work due to take approximately three months




Works carried out on the N63 at Barnacor - before (left) and after (right)

#### World Remembrance Day

World Remembrance Day for Road Traffic Victims is Sunday, 21 November. The Council is inviting businesses and householders to 'Shine a Light' for road crash victims. An amber or white light will shine on public buildings while people are also invited to shine a light in their front windows on the evening.

As we know, Gardaí, fire and ambulance personnel are the first responders to road traffic incidents, and based on last year's success, all services are invited to line-out and shine a light outside their stations and base.



#### Road Safety

The Tik Tok Road Safety Campaign ran on iRadio in March 2021, in conjunction with the Local Road Safety Officers Group. iRadio won a Silver Award for Best Digital and Social Innovation Campaign for the work at the IMRO Radio Awards for 2021.

Irish Road Safety Week ran from the 4 October to 10 October 2021. Local schools took part in road safety activities and competitions which were run by the Local Authority Road Safety Officer during the week. In addition to this, the Play It Safe Road Safety Programme was offered by the RSA Road Safety Promotion Officer and delivered to schools.


Water Services

### Find & Fix Programme

Longford County Council Find & Fix team recently completed a Find & Fix campaign in the Corn Hill-Drumlish area of County Longford achieving savings of approximately 58,000 litres of treated drinking water per day. The Find & Fix team are currently operating in the Ballinalee and Longford Town District Metered Areas (DMAs).

### Think before you flush

Longford County Council is supporting an Irish Water Think before you flush campaign to raise awareness of the damage and costs of unsuitable items being flushed down toilets. Blockages in the wastewater system are known as fatbergs, with one recently cleared from the wastewater network at Temple Michael Terrace at a cost of €1,500.



### Capital Network Schemes

Water Services Capital section are currently liaising with Irish Water to progress three capital network

rehabilitation schemes:

- Cahanagh-Prucklish: replacement of c.400 l/m of problematic watermain between Cahanagh Cross and Prucklish (along the R198)
- Rathcline Road, Lanesborough: replacement of approximately 2.5km of problematic watermain between Lanesborough and Carrowroe reservoir
- Creevy, Granard: replacement of approximately 500 metres of problematic watermain

These works ensure security of supply and contribute to reducing leakage. These works are funded by Irish Water's National Leakage Reduction Programme.

### Small Towns and Villages Growth

Small Towns and Villages Growth Programme, under the Irish Water 2020-2024 Capital Investment Plan, will fund a project to provide additional wastewater treatment capacity at Killashee. This project now proceeds to the design stage.

This also supports the recently-published Housing for All strategy, as well as the achievement several objectives and outcomes of the National Planning and Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies. It is focused on providing for growth in areas already served by Irish Water infrastructure where current or future capacity deficits have been identified.

### Longford Town Plan

Work now has commenced on the review of the Longford Town Plan to include a Transport Study, Affordable Housing, Climate Change, Active Travel and co-ordinating various development projects.

### Applications and Enforcement

The Planning Section's public counter is now open to accept planning applications and deal with public queries once again.

Statutory requirements maintained:

- Managing the various planning applications, housing, retail, industrial proposals, Section 284 license applications for outdoor seating and broadband, Part 8 planning schemes, CPOs, and enforcement
- Planning administrative office, public counter and technical advice and reports kept fully functioning
- Assisting in the implementation of the housing, regeneration and climate change programme

### County Development Plan

Longford County Development Plan 2021-2027 was adopted on 19 October. The Chief Executive's report on public consultation in regard to the proposed material amendments where discussed and the Draft Plan was approved by the members for adoption. The new Plan will be in effect on the 30 November 2021. Work is ongoing in relation to amending the final document as required and publishing the Plan.

### Columbarium Wall

The construction of the Columbarium Wall at Ballymacormack Cemetery was completed in October 2021. There are 40 niches, each capable of accepting two urns.



### Historic Landfills

Longford County Council has lodged applications with the EPA for Certificates of Authorisation for Cartron Big and Ballymulvey historic landfills

### International E-Waste Day

International E-Waste Day took place on Thursday, 14 October 2021. The day saw leading experts call on households, businesses and governments to support efforts to get more end-of-life or unused plug-in or battery-operated products to authorised facilities, where they can be either repaired or recycled. Irish homes contain an average of 15 to 20 electrical items which are broken or unused. So to mark International E-Waste Day, WEEE Ireland challenged families to become e-detectives in October and follow electrical leads around their homes to identify at least five hoarded devices that are beyond repair and ready for recycling. Successful Large Goods Collection Another successful large goods collection took place at Mulleady's Civic Amenity site Drumlish on Friday, 1 October.



Over nine tonnes of materials were collected for recycling and disposal. Due to the ongoing restrictions the number of these types of collections have had to be reduced, meaning more members of the public were ready to make use of this one.



These collections are very important as they help reduce the build up of bulky goods in the community and prevent them from ending up being dumped along country roads and in our bogs.

- Probationary volunteers are continuing with their induction and Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) training

### **Climate Action Initiatives**

#### Library Services

Retrofitting of doors and windows in Longford Branch Library has taken place and low energy lighting has been installed throughout.

#### Roads

Construction work is ongoing on two projects which are funded under the Climate Adaption & Resilience Fund 2021. Embankment stabilisation works including fencing, drainage, rock fill and verge construction are currently taking place on the R198 at Tawnagh. Drainage installation works are taking place in Abbeylara village to alleviate flooding issues on the R396.



### Planning

- Following the adoption of the County Plan consideration is now being given to drawing up climate change actions in the county. This will include work on Active Travel for Longford Town.
- A preliminary list of actions is being prepared including the implementation of the Lough Ree UNESCO Biosphere proposal.

### Veterinary Services

Longford Dog Control Services commenced an energy audit process for the Dog Pound and Dog Warden vehicle in October.

#### Information Systems

- The section is progressing several paperless projects including the eCorporate Planning and ePMDS apps which are being launched presently.
- The Head of Information Systems, as a member of the organisation's climate action team, is currently attending Building Capacity Training as part of the Eastern & Midlands CARO Region.

### Regeneration

• Installation of energy efficient solar LED lighting at Red Bridge, Ballymahon alongside new jetty project.

### Housing

- Four council estates in Ballinalee are included in the Midlands Retrofitting Programme – River Crescent and Camlin View are now completed, while Cois na habhainn and Hill View are ongoing.
- Tender in progress for St Matthew's Park, Ballymahon
- Assessment of works required is underway on the 46 local authority houses in the county.
- Tenders has been received under the National Energy Efficiency Programme for the 20 houses at Slí na Móna, Ballymahon and works are due to commence on 8 November 2021.

#### **Fire Services**

The Fire Service fleet is being surveyed for its CO2 emissions based on annual fuel consumption.
